Some of us even play this game in life, trying to stack our 'to do' list so high without having them topple over. Pulling that one 'to do' item from the stack without the rest toppling to the floor.

Here it is only February and I am already holding my breath as I pull each 'to do' item from my list of many. I figure this could be a messy game if I keep playing by the rules of Jenga but what if I changed the rules?

A few years ago, for Christmas I was given a hand towel with the manger scene on it and the words, "He started with a stable foundation." Yes, I keep this hanging up year-round in my home office and read it again the other day. Which got me to thinking about the game Jenga. The blocks topple in this game because you compromise the foundation to stack more on top.

I do not have to do it all, the only thing I must keep up on is building a strong relationship and foundation with Jesus Christ and the rest will fall where they are supposed to fall.

John Wesley was known to get up an hour earlier than his day was to begin just to pray. When asked if he did this even on his busiest days he offered, "On the busy days, I get up two hours early." Mr. Wesley knew the importance of a strong foundation to begin his day.

If you find yourself playing the real game of Jenga, enjoy and let the block fall where they may but if this concept is creeping into your life, stop what you are doing and build a firm foundation with Jesus. Everything is so much easier when you have a stable place to stand when life starts to topple. Remember your foundation is important, start building it today.

Financial Data—. The weekly average tithing for December was \$3,196. In December our General Operating Fund had \$5,358. Our year-to-date income was \$1,171 less than the plan.
